We hear their stories unfold through their own narratives, although the sources of their words vary from comprehensive biography to collection of letters. Through the telling of their stories and helpful commentary by the author, himself an African, we can read first hand accounts of life as a slave and freed man in the 18th century. All had strong religious beliefs and we are able to hear their personal views and reflections on a range of topics including Christianity, God, humanity and the slave trade itself.
